How the Gospel Can Transform Your Family

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- Identifying the failing recipe for a godly family
- How to find hope in brokenness
- Practical steps for changing your family's focus

Takeaways:

- Through the family, God communicates a picture of His relationship with the Son and His relationship with His redeemed people.
- We have to understand the significance of the fall and our brokenness in order to understand the great need we have for redemption.
- If you think you have everything together, you will fall apart at the sight of brokenness in your family.
- There is nothing too far gone for God. The dry bones can live again.
- We have a great need and we have a great hope the person and work of Jesus Christ.

Family Life: How God Intends a Family to Function Together

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- Why a vision for family unity changes everything
- The definition and development of a family economy
- A simple way to bring gospel truth to light

Takeaways:

- Scripturally, the family is viewed as a "household" and operates as a unit. Family unity is highly unusual for our day, but it is important biblically.
- Relationships are an opportunity for both love and conflict to develop — but conflict is another opportunity for love to grow.
- Without humility, you cannot reach conflict resolution and love for one another.
- God brings us into relationships so our sin is brought to light and the truth of the gospel brings us grace — and in it, God is glorified.
- Discipleship opportunities abound with family unity.

Key things to listen for in the video session:

Key things to listen for in the video session:

Takeaways:

- We waste our lives if we are not living to love like Christ.
- Once you start trying to write the story of what your family should be, you have just stepped into God's place. He has already determined the story of your family — to love.
- You can't truly love the people you are idolizing or hoping to "get something from."
- Every time we love, the Father and Son rejoice together in what they have done.

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- The top 3 reasons for conflict
- Identifying the internal attitudes that hinder relationships and hinder conflict resolution
- How to deepen your family's communication

Takeaways:

- As Christians, we should be the best communicators in the world, because God has given us so much wisdom about communication in His Word.
- Dependence on God's grace is the biggest key to communicating in a way that builds up our family.
- Humility results in a willingness to see and take responsibility for our relational faults.

A Generational Approach to Family Relationships

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- The high stakes of building a family legacy
- How to create a family culture map
- Three things to change your family's trajectory

Takeaways:

- Every generation has to take ownership of what they've received and what they will leave for the next generation.
 Many people take either one or both ends of this for granted — either they don't understand what they've received, or don't understand their responsibility to put things into place for the next generation.
- Often a generation will inherit something and enjoy it as a beautiful gift, not understanding the responsibility of stewardship to take that, benefit from it, and pass it on to the next generation.
- Ask yourself, "Where do I want to be?" Then it's a matter of determining the small, tangible steps to get you there.
- Relationships cannot stand under the pressure of perfectionism.

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- How to fight for right expectations
- The biblical way to seek happiness
- Ways to nurture your children through your marriage

Takeaways:

- When you expect everything from your marriage partner, you're putting too much weight on that person. When you put all expectations on Christ, He is honored.
- As special as your marriage is, there will always be times when you are disappointed in your spouse and disappointed in yourself. You need a rock outside of yourselves to lean on.
- One of the best things you can ever do for your children is to elevate and prioritize your marriage.

Key things to listen for in the video session:

Takeaways:

- Glean from the wisdom of other homeschool moms, rather than comparing yourself to them.
- Your marriage is meant to last longer than your homeschool career. Your marriage is a model of Christ and the church, and its purpose is not solely to raise children.

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- Relational keys that are more important than date nights
- One small habit that can make or break relationships
- The easiest way to build your relationship today
- How to recognize and avoid the "danger zone" of a crisis

Takeaways:

- Are you looking for a date night? Or a long-lasting friendship in your marriage?
- We tend to want a large-scale step to improve a relationship, but it is in the small things that friendships are formed or broken.
- The real-life, daily interactions in a relationship show what it is really made of.

Takeaways:

- Understand together why you are choosing homeschooling even before you begin. Husbands can be a huge encouragement to their wives by remembering and reminding them of these goals when the going gets tough.
- Homeschooling is ultimately not about the school part, it's about the home part.
- It's not about learning a lot of stuff, but about loving and being home together.

- Your marriage is bigger than your enjoyment and happiness.
- When we do what Scripture says, we are shining lights in a dark world.
- Stop thinking like an American and start thinking like a Christian who knows their Bible.

Key things to listen for in the video session:

- How failures can point our children (and us!) in the right direction
- Practical steps for addressing your child's sin
- The purpose and power of loving discipline

Takeaways:

- Tactics like counting to three or threatening are simply things that draw children away from instantly and completely obeying in a way that honors God.
- It is never enough to simply tell a child what not to do and administer consequences to them. Instead, walk them through what is right to do.
- Avoiding consequences is not the goal. Honoring God and bringing Him glory is the goal.
- Using your own words and your own wisdom will not benefit your children. They need to hear God's words and God's wisdom!

- We can't get relationships outside the home right until we get our relationships inside the home right.
- Sibling relationships have more importance than other friendships because God hand-picked each family member.
- Kids need to see their parents model how to be a blessing to each other.
- As children get older, they need the space to resolve sibling conflicts on their own, instead of always needing a parent to be involved.

- The first step towards teaching your children teamwork is teaching them humility. Humility breeds unity but pride is always toxic.
- We can accomplish exponentially more and work exponentially faster for God when we work as a team.
- Prayer is an amazing unifier because it brings God into your brokenness and dysfunction, allowing Him to work through and turn your weaknesses into gifts.
