Course Objectives

This course has been designed with the following goals:

- To provide the child with a clear understanding of biblical vocabulary, preparing them to read a substantive English translation of the Bible on their own.
- To grant the child a familiarity with the full scope of biblical stories—the historical narrative of God's revelation—by providing seventy-one key stories from Scripture written on a third-grade level.
- To master the entire theme of the Bible, the Christ-focus of Scripture, and the fulfillment of the Old Testament in the New Testament.
- To believe the Gospel.
- To worship God, to fear God, and to obey His Word.

Workbook Description

This book includes exercises for each chapter of *God's Big Story Level 3*. Two types of exercises are included within this workbook. *Core exercises* are designed to assist children in learning new vocabulary and in reviewing the material studied in the corresponding textbook reading. *Optional exercises* are designed to reinforce elementary concepts of grammar, spelling, composition, and handwriting. If parents prefer a shorter workbook period for their child, the optional exercises can be skipped without missing any crucial elements of the course. Please be aware that each child learns differently. Parents should therefore adapt this workbook to suit their child's individual needs.

On page 20, a list of Dolch sight words for third grade is included. Parents may find it helpful to create flashcards or other learning aids to assist their child in the recognition and pronunciation of these words.

Pages 7–19 offer a recommended schedule and semester outline for the completion of *God's Big Story Level 3*. However, parents should feel free to alter this schedule as needed. There is no right or wrong method of using this curriculum. Please adjust it as needed to suit your child.

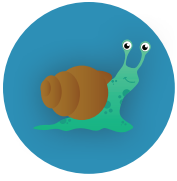
